From the President

From the President:

The annual AAVP meeting means many different things to those who attend, but at its core, I believe it represents **opportunity**. The opportunity to learn new scientific information to incorporate into our research, teaching, or extension programs; the opportunity for graduate students to meet the authors who have contributed to their educations; and the opportunity for all of us to renew and make new friendships with those who are our colleagues for a lifetime.

This year, we will meet jointly in Philadelphia with the American Society of Parasitologists from July 24 – 28, 2004. In addition to all the usual benefits, this meeting represents a unique opportunity for the society to assess its present role in the scientific community, and to evaluate how direct interaction with sister organizations can expand our prospects. The program co-chairs, Dr. Don Duszynski and Dr. Ann Donoghue, have nearly completed the Proceedings for the meeting. In addition to almost 200 original papers and posters, several symposia have been planned on topics that include basic science, the economic impact of human and zoonotic parasitoses, and potential employment opportunities in parasitology. Industrial support remains a strong bulwark of our organization, and two evening socials have been funded by generous corporate sponsors. The AAVP has been invited to participate in the ASP's traditional auction to support graduate students.

The AAVP Executive Board meeting will convene at 8:00 AM on July 24, and chairpersons are encouraged to prepare agendas for their respective committees in the coming year. Highlights from the Executive Board will be

reported at the general business meeting at 3:30 PM on July 27, along with additional discussion of future directions for AAVP. Other features of the AAVP business meeting will include presentation of the Distinguished Veterinary Parasitologist and AAVP-Intervet Graduate Student Awards for 2004, and announcement of the recipients of AAVP Travel Grants.

The coming year will bring important changes to our organization. Dr. Dan Snyder will step down as the society's Secretary/Treasurer after 6 years of dedicated and faithful service, and Dan deserves our sincere gratitude. Dr. Snyder won't be getting much of a rest, however, because he has been newly elected as the Vice President/Program Chair for the 2005 meeting in Minneapolis. Dr. Alan Marchiondo has been selected to fill the key position of Secretary/Treasurer, and AI will appreciate your support during the transition. We still have a few vacancies on existing committees, and new ones will be created as current members rotate off

AAVP Election Results: Report from the Nominations Committee

The members of the 2004 AAVP Nominations Committee worked together to prepare the slate of nominees for AAVP. First, my thanks to our elected Nominations Committee members for all their efforts to get such a good slate of candidates for office in our society: Lora Ballweber, Sharon Patton, Tom Nolan, Dwight Bowman, and Karen Snowden.

The nomination process was based on the plan developed by Phil Scholl, the previous Chair. Each committee member suggested nominees for each open position: Vice President, Secretary-Treasurer, and new members of the Nominations Committee. By Dec 10, 2003, a summary of potential nominees was available. That list was then ranked by all nominations committee members so that, by Jan 12, 2004, the final slate of nominees was available. Nominees were contacted and biographies collected. The February

newsletter included the final ballot information and biographies of all nominees: 2 members for Vice President, 2 for Secretary-Treasurer, and 5 for Nominations Committee members.

With the conversion of the newsletter to all-electronic distribution, the official hard-copy ballot was sent out with the AAVP meeting mailing in early February, allowing the constitutionally required 60 days for voting. It was a separate pre-addressed, pre-stamped mailing to each member of AAVP. Completed ballots were received by April 12, 2004 by me as Chair, Nominations Committee. Ballots were received from 41% of our membership (170 ballots of 409 possible). Thanks to my technician, Daniel Kuhar, who independently verified vote counts for each position. And a special thanks to everyone who agreed to run for AAVP offices; for those who did not win, we hope you will consider running again.

The objectives of the AAVP and its requirements for membership (Articles II and III of the AAVP Constitution) are:

Objectives: "The objectives of the organization shall be to provide for the association of persons interested in the advancement of veterinary parasitology, and for the presentation and discussion of items of common interest, and to further scientific progress by education and research in veterinary parasitology. This association is organized exclusively for scientific and educational purposes within the meaning of section 501(C)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. Notwithstanding any other provision of this constitution, the Association shall not carry out any other activities not permitted to be carried out by an organization exempt from Federal Income Tax under section 501(C)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code."

Membership: "Section 1: Members shall consist of those individuals qualified by background, education and interest in veterinary parasitology. Section 2: New members, except honorary and emeritus, shall be admitted by the Secretary-Treasurer with approval of the Executive Committee, after filing application for membership to the association. Section 3: Honorary membership shall be awarded by the Association to persons who are not members of the Association in recognition of outstanding and sustained achievements in veterinary parasitology. Candidates for honorary membership shall be recommended to the awards committee by any member. Nomination for honorary membership shall be made by the Awards Committee to the membership and election shall be majority vote at the annual meeting. Honorary members shall not be eligible to vote and shall not be assessed dues. No more than two (2) honorary members shall be elected in any one-year period. Section 4: Upon retirement a member may become an emeritus member on approval of the Executive Committee of a written request to the Secretary-Treasurer for such status. Emeritus members shall retain voting rights but shall not be assessed dues. Section 5: Forfeiture of membership will occur where dues are not paid for at least two consecutive years. A member who has forfeited membership by nonpayment of dues must reapply for membership. Section 6: Expulsion of a member may occur if a motion for expulsion is presented by the Executive Committee at the annual meeting and passed by four-fifths (4/5) of the members present and voting. The member is to be informed in writing of such a motion at least two months in advance of the annual meeting at which the motion is to be presented. Section 7: The Executive Committee may annually invite any firm, association, corporation, institution or subdivision thereof, to become a corporate associate member, for financial support of the Association."
